Mobility Management System—Connie Willman

Funding for the mobility Management System for the Meramec Region has been approved from MoDOT and the Missouri Development Disabilities Council. Staff updated the board on the planned project and how it will be implemented across the region.

The Meramec Region Mobility Management System will seek to increase transportation opportunities for all residents of the region through partnerships between local officials, transportation providers and education of available transportation opportunities. The program, when fully implemented, will be a one-stop for transit information in the region. The information will be accessible via the web and phone.

External Relations Committee: Ray Schwartze reported on External Relations Committee activities as follows: Staff provided information on the hour allocation policy and suggestions for revisions. As allowed in the policy, local governments are donating their hours to other entities for grant writing purposes. These entities are asking staff to work on multiple projects rather than just one grant application. The committee discussed proposed suggestions and liked the restriction of one application. The discussion will continue at the June 11 meeting.

Staff shared that there were no responses for the annual dinner site solicitation., but T.R. Dudley volunteered to work with the YMCA Trout Lodge in Washington County to host the dinner. The deadline to submit nominations for awards is June 5.

Mark Boyer made the motion to work with T.R. Dudley on having the annual dinner at the Trout Lodge in Washington County; Dave Dudenhoeffer seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Staff provided the recommended language change for the bylaws in reference to at-large for farming to be changed to at-large for farming/ag-business. James Morgan made a motion to approve the bylaws change presented; Gene Newkirk seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Planning Committee James Morgan reported on Planning Committee activities as follows: Staff provided an overview of how illegal dumping surveillance program works. Ozark Rivers provides a grant to MRPC to work with local government experiencing illegal dumping issues on public land and right of ways. The district is in the process of purchasing and updating equipment.

Housing Advisory Board Ray Schwartze reported that staff presented the financial statements for the period ended April 30, 2015. An election of officers was held, and is as follows: Chairman-Ray Schwartze, Vice Chair-Leo Sanders and Secretary-Darrell Skiles. The 2015 utility allowance was presented and approved.

Environmental and Meramec Regional Emergency Planning Committee Staff passed out reports on environmental and MREPC activities. Report is attached.
