Call to Order

Sustainable Ozarks Partnership (SOP), Joe Driskill, Executive Director-Leonard Wood Institute

Mr. Driskill's updated the board on the March 2, 2015 Department of Army Listening Session and how the Meramec Region can support Ft. Leonard Wood. Many jobs at Ft. Leonard Wood are in danger and Mr. Driskill encouraged board members to attend the listening session on March 2 at 5:30, Nutter Fieldhouse. They would like to see 2,000 in attendance.

External Relations Committee

Ray Schwartze reported on External Relations Committee activities as follows:

• MRPC Day at the Capitol

The committee discussed the visit to the Capitol on January 27. Lunch was served outside of Sen. Brown's office. The delegation visited with most of the legislators, staff felt it was a good visit.

The committee also discussed the legislative update and recommending to the full board a letter of opposition in regards to HB 332 and HB 554. The proposed legislation will reduce the threshold for general operating revenue coming from traffic fines for cities, towns, villages or counties from 30 percent to 10 percent. This legislation if passed would have a significant impact on smaller communities in the region and how they provide law enforcement.

Ray Schwartze made a motion to send a letter of opposition to HB 332 and HB 554, the proposed legislation to reduce the threshold for traffic fines for cities from 30 percent to 10 percent, Randy Verkamp seconded the motion. The motion carried.

• Federal Priorities for 2014

The committee reviewed the federal priorities. Changes will be made to number four under Local Government Issues, dealing with the PILT program to include the SSC Act. Randy Verkamp made a motion to approve the federal priorities as presented, Gene Newkirk seconded the motion. The motion carried. The Federal Priorities will be taken to Washington, D.C., by Chairman Dudley and Tammy Snodgrass on March 23-25.

• Annual Dinner

The committee discussed the dates for the annual dinner. The annual dinner is going to be in October. The dates chosen for the RFP are October 1, 2, and 23.

Operations Committee

Gene Newkirk reported on Operations Committee activities as follows:

•Financials

Gene Newkirk made a motion to approve the MRPC financial statements and MRPC/MRDC-RLF & IRP program financial statements for the period ended January 31, 2015; seconded by Ray Schwartze. The motion carried.

•Title VI Civil Rights Act Affirmative Action Policy

Staff presented the Title VI Civil Rights Act Affirmative Action Policy prohibiting discrimination in programs and activities receiving federal assistance, especially transportation projects. Gene Newkirk made a motion to approve the policy as presented, seconded by Steve Vogt. The motion carried.

•Office of Administration Planning Funds

Staff updated the committee regarding this funding allocation from the state. The Governor has taken the funding out of his proposed budget. The House has put it back in, and it will go to the Select Budget Committee. Staff is hoping Senate will keep it in.

James Morgan reported on Planning Committee activities as follows:

- Staff reported on the Associate Membership program and its importance and impact on MRPC.
- A short presentation on ORSWMD's Earth Day Poster and Trash Art contest was provided.
- Staff gave an overview of the Naturally Meramec grant.

Transportation Advisory Committee

John Casey reported on Transportation Advisory Committee as follows:

Preston Kramer, MoDOT area engineer, provided information on the MoDOT 325 Plan recently adopted by the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission. In response to reduced funding, this plan will change the way MoDOT handles the repair and maintenance of transportation infrastructure in the future. In 2017 funding will drop to 325 million. At that funding level the primary system will be maintained. At this time, 90 percent of the primary system is in good shape and 70 percent of the secondary system. At this funding level, the secondary bridges and roadways will take the biggest hit. By 2017, there will be no state funds to match federal funds for projects.

Under the 325 plan, roughly 8000 miles of state highways are considered primary and will be maintained. The balance (roughly, 24,000) will be considered secondary and will only be maintained by local forces, meaning only pot holes will be fixed, snow removed and brush cut.

Bonnie Prigge updated the committee on fatalities in the region; over 68 percent were not wearing seat belts.
