• USDA Rural Development Farmers Market Promotion Program

On June 17, 2014, MRPC staff contacted the seven Executive Committee members, two in person and five via email, for approval to submit a grant application to USDA Rural Development Farmers Market Promotion Program for funding to complete Phase II of the Naturally Meramec project and authorizing the executive director to sign the grant application. Grant deadline was June 20, 2014. Five of the seven Executive Committee members, responded, all giving permission to submit the application. The remaining members did not respond to the request. Per the bylaws, staff is requesting that the full board affirm the Executive Committee's action.

Permission is requested that the chairman and/or executive director to be authorized to accept the grant, should it be awarded, and sign the grant award agreement and all other necessary documents.

• Gasconade Valley Enterprise Zone

Permission is requested for MRPC's chairman and/or executive director to sign a contract amendment of its 2013-2014 contract with the Gasconade Valley Enterprise Zone to cover cost overruns associated with the administration of the Certified Work Ready Communities planning projects, which was billed as a part of the existing contract instead of separately as originally intended. GVEZ board approved this contract increase at its June meeting.

4...... EPA's Clean Power Plan to Cut Carbon Emissions on Existing Power Plants, Don Shaw, CEO/General Manager of Central Electric Power Cooperative

......... Mr. Shaw will discuss the impact of proposed EPA regulations to reduce carbon emission on existing power plants among other EPA regulations impacting cooperatives, and in turn impacting local governments and businesses. Shaw has served at Central Electric for over 40 years, starting as an electrical engineer and advancing with positions as the chief engineer and manager of engineering and technical services. He was selected as the CEO/General Manager in 1992 and continues in that role. Central Electric Power Cooperative is headquartered in Jefferson City and is an electric generation and transmission cooperative. Central is owned by and delivers power to eight distribution cooperatives, including Three Rivers Electric Cooperative in Linn.
