- Complete this proposal to summarize your entity's proposed project. Answer all sections.
- A maximum of \$50,000 may be requested for each project. Applicants may submit applications for more than one project. Awarded funds must be obligated from March 3, 2021 through December 31, 2024, and expended by December 31, 2026.
- Applicants that have received \$45,000 or more of ARPA funds (from any agency) may have their project(s) tabled for consideration in future rounds of ARPA funding.
- Be sure to cite the relevant expense code from the identification key attached to the application.
- Submit a copy of all supporting documentation for the proposed scope and cost.
 Please note that all expenditures of awarded funds are subject to 2 CFR 200: Uniform
 Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards.
 In addition to other requirements, this means that, while vendor quotes may be used to compile a project budget, vendors must be chosen through a formal procurement process.
