### Program Details:

- Free lead-based paint inspection and risk assessment conducted by a state licensed contractor. A full report of the findings will be provided to the property owners and occupants.
- Blood lead level testing for children under the age of 6 conducted by a local health department at no out-of-pocket cost.
- Up to \$15,000 worth of FREE lead paint remediation completed by licensed lead abatement contractors for owner-occupied housing. Rental properties owners must match 15% of the total project cost.
- Free clearance testing after the work is completed to ensure all hazards have been removed and the property is safe for occupation.
