## Moving Foward

After nearly 35 years here at MRPC, I thought I had seen it all...but this past year has been one for the books. As I write this, our federal government is shutdown. We have experienced shutdowns in the past. The most recent was for 35 days from December 2018 to January 2019.

During a shutdown, our work continues as our focus is on our local cities and counties, but it does get more difficult. Our contacts for our federal programs are usually among those who are furloughed. In some cases, reporting deadlines may be suspended, and reimbursement requests that allow us to pay the bills will not be processed. If we have questions on a federal grant program or project, we must wait for our federal government to re-open.

There are exceptions, like the Federal Highways Administration whose staff are paid through the Highway Trust Fund. They are working as we had a Teams meeting on our Rock Island Trail BUILD project on Wednesday, the first day of the shutdown. We have the funds to pay rent and utilities for the nearly 700 families who we assist each month through the Phelps County Public Housing Agency's Housing Voucher Choice program.

As we navigate these interesting times, I am grateful that, for the most part, the local elected officials and at-large board members are able to leave their political hats at the front door and discuss the issues and look for solutions for problems facing our cities and counties. While not everyone may agree, they have a seat at the table and are part of the conversation, and our focus is always on making our cities and our counties—and their residents— stronger.

Some things came to an end this past fiscal year. MRPC and the Meramec Regional Development Corp. voluntarily decertified from the Small Business Administration's 504 program. This program had become very difficult to staff and had become a financial drain on MRPC, so it was time to end the bleed. Our businesses and banks have access to SBA products, and our involvement was no longer necessary. The same was true with our USDA Intermediary Lending Program. This was a loan from USDA to MRPC, and defaulted loan funds had to be repaid. We had some defaults, which we repaid, but it was time to end that program as well, as the risk was more than our small organization wanted to take. We still have plenty of revolving loan funds that we can assist local businesses and banks with riskier projects that they may need a partner to make happen, and we stand ready to help.

Unfortunately, our agritourism project, Naturally Meramec, came to an end, as we were unable to secure funding to continue those efforts, as did our work in opioid awareness and education. We are proud of the progress we made in these areas. Sometimes our job is to bring the

issue to light, bring people together, build consensus and move things forward....and then hand-off the baton to other organizations who are better equipped to take



the work to the next level.

We secured the largest grant in MRPC's history in January 2025, and it was put on hold with the change in administration. We were awarded a \$17 Million RAISE—now called BUILD grant—from Federal Highways Administration for planning work for preliminary engineering, environmental analysis and benefit-cost analysis for the undeveloped sections of the Rock Island Trail State Park across Missouri. In July 2025, we were notified that the project would move forward, and we are in grant agreement negotiations. Not only is it the largest grant MRPC has been awarded, but it will probably be one of the most complex.

This year, in partnership with MODoT, we formed a Multimodal Advisory Committee to better identify needs within other transportation modes. We have a active and effective Transportation Advisory Committee to look at needs on state roadways. While we tried to work multimodal needs in with that, they certainly did not get the attention they deserved, so our hope is that our Multimodal Advisory Committee will be able to provide grassroots input on the multimodal needs and work to address them.

We are very appreciative of the folks who volunteer their time to our many boards and committees. Our work depends on the knowledge that these folks are willing to share. They are our subject-matter experts, and we can't do our work without our elected officials and volunteers.

And we cannot do it without the MRPC staff. Our 24-staff member are dedicated and invested. Housing Inspector/Coordinator Teresa Murdie celebrated 44 years with MRPC this year. Senior Housing Coordinator Elaine Cloyde celebrated 37 years while Senior Housing Coordinator Tammy Rigsby was honored for 35 years of service. Assistant Director Tammy Snodgrass has been with MRPC for 32 years. Connie Willman, who filled a variety of roles over the years, retired in July 2024, with 30 years of service. Fiscal officer Linda Loughridge celebrated 30 years of service, and Project Development Manager Kelly Sink reached the 25-year mark with MRPC. Every day, I am honored to work with our committed staff and board to make the Meramec Region an even better place to live and work. I thank each of you who play a role, share our vision and partner with us.

## Strength Through Regional Collaboration

Recognizing the strength of regional collaboration, local officials requested that Missouri Gov. Warren E. Hearnes establish a regional planning body. On Jan. 23, 1969, the Meramec Regional Planning Commission (MRPC) was created, originally covering Crawford, Dent, Gasconade, Maries, Phelps, and Washington counties. Osage and Pulaski counties were later added in 1997 and

2005, respectively, under the 1965 State and Regional Planning and Community Development Act.

Today, MRPC represents an eight-county region with 196,265 residents across 36 communities. For over 56 years, it has worked to enhance quality of life for area residents by helping communities remain competitive in areas like government funding, environmental services, affordable housing and urban amenities that attract newcomers to the

## Growth Through Regional Partnerships

By building strong partnerships across its eight-county region, MRPC brings cities and counties together to pursue shared goals and access resources that might otherwise be out of reach. This collaboration helps create cleaner, healthier and safer communities, drives economic and cultural development, and ensures the region speaks with a unified voice in legislative matters.

MRPC works hand-in-hand with local communities to improve quality of life by connecting people, fostering

collaboration, and shaping the region's future through strategic planning. These plans serve as roadmaps for key initiatives—such as grant writing, floodplain management, and transportation planning.

Through regional partnerships, MRPC also coordinates programs that promote recycling, safe driving, and more. It offers vital services like small business loans and rental assistance to meet the evolving needs of the Meramec Region.

### Working For Cleaner, Healthier and Safer Communities

MRPC strives to help promote cleaner, healthier and safer communities by providing administrative and project implementation services for the Meramec Local Emergency Planning District (MLEPD), Ozark Rivers Solid Waste Management District (ORSWMD); Region I Homeland Security Oversight Committee (HSOC); and also provides hazard mitigation planning for Meramec counties.

The Pulaski County Hazard Mitigation Plan is currently being updated. The plan includes an assessment of natural hazards and establishes goals and action items to reduce the impact of these hazards in the future.

The plans are a collaborative effort of county and city leadership, first responders, school officials, other agencies and citizens. Counties must have a hazard mitigation plan in order to access certain federal grant funds.

Maintaining safe, affordable housing is essential to quality of life. In FY24-25, the Phelps County Public Housing Agency (PHA), administered by MRPC, provided over \$3.4 million in HUD Housing Choice Voucher assistance to an average of 700 households monthly. Participants choose their homes, which MRPC staff inspect for safety and affordability before paying landlords directly. Staff conducted 1,092 inspections and held briefing sessions, which all new applicants must participate in before receiving their voucher.

PHA also operates the Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS) program, helping families work toward independence from Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF). Currently, 65 families are enrolled. These participants set goals under a five-year contract to become self-sufficient. The main goal is to support and encourage those who wish to meet their full potential and work towards becoming independent of government assistance. The program works in that when incomes rise, housing aid decreases, and the difference is placed into an escrow account. Upon completion of their goals and graduation from the program, families receive the full escrow balance. In FY24-25, eight families graduated, receiving a combined \$46,210.33.

#### Ozark Rivers Solid Waste Management District



In February 2025, Ozark Rivers and the Mark Twain National Forest hosted a team of Americorp volunteers who worked to clean up illegal dumps on forest land. In seven days, the group cleaned 26 dumpsites and cleared 7.16 tons of trash and 1,587 pounds of tires.

Ozark Rivers Solid Waste Management District (OR-SWMD) contracts with MRPC to implement programs and administer grants with the goal of reducing waste landfilled by 40 percent in the region. This is accomplished through community grants, reuse and recycling programs, educational programs for district schools and media awareness.

Four special collections were held during fiscal year 2024-25 (Rolla, Dixon, St. Robert and Vienna). A total of 48.59 tons of recyclable e-waste, appliances and tires were collected and diverted from landfills. For two collections, media storage recycling was added and resulted in 1,620 pounds of mixed media being recycled.

Additionally, the Ozark Rivers Solid Waste Management District held two illegal dump cleanups with 22

volunteers and worked with eight AmeriCorps members for seven days in the region, removing a total of 6.95 tons of tires, 80 pounds of recyclable material and 13.31 tons of trash from national forest land and county roads. The district also continued to monitor for illegal dumping through its surveillance camera that is available to cities and counties within the district.

In partnership with Ozark Rivers, MRPC and the cities of Rolla and St. Robert provide the opportunity for residents to properly dispose of household hazardous wastes (HHW), adding vape products. Some 1,117 households were served.

This year, Ozark Rivers celebrated

its 34th annual Earth Day Poster/Trash Art contest with 779 entries from 14 schools and 14 homeschool students. The theme was "Put Waste in its Place."

In 2022, Ozark Rivers implemented the Trashasaurus Illegal Dump campaign, which utilizes an inflatable dinosaur mascot (with an MRPC staff member inside) to highlight the problem of illegal dumps in the Meramec Region through a social media campaign. Trashasaurus videos have expanded to include recycling and waste reduction tips, highlighting successful grant projects and raising awareness of environmental issues.

Ozark Rivers also continued its membership with the Missouri Product Stewardship Council, which is focused on recycling paint, tires and mattresses — three items that are difficult to recycle.



#### Meramec Local Emergency Planning District

The Meramec Local Emergency Planning District (MLEPD) serves local governments in Crawford, Dent, Gasconade, Maries, Osage, Phelps and Washington counties and contracts with MRPC to maintain a federally required plan to deal with hazardous material emergencies in the region. The district coordinates and offers training opportunities for emergency responders in the region.

With approximately 13,000 miles of roadway, as well as pipelines and rail, it is important to understand what is being transported through our region. The MLEPD coordinated a tabletop exercise with Region 7 Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) with a train derailment scenar-

io in July 2024. 39 participants from all seven counties participated.

These trainings help first responders work through and plan their responses in the event of a hazardous materials accident in their jurisdiction. There are 344.7 miles of pipeline carrying primarily hazard Class 2 and Class 3 commodities and 267 miles of railway in the region.

Kraig Bone of Washington County is chairman of MLEPD, while Jeff Breen of Phelps County serves as vice chair and Wendy Squires of Phelps County serves as secretary/treasurer. The group meets quarterly.

#### Region I Homeland Security Oversight Committee

MRPC serves as the fiscal agent and grantee for homeland security dollars for the six-county Region I area that includes Crawford, Dent, Maries, Phelps, Pulaski and Laclede counties. Planning efforts to keep the region prepared are ongoing with the Region I Homeland Security Oversight Committee (HSOC).

Leadership for the Region I HSOC this year was Tabitha Stanfast of Salem Memorial District Hospital, as chair, and Jeff Breen of Rolla City Fire and Rescue, as vice chairman.

The committee continues to make tough funding decisions to ensure first responders in Region I have the necessary tools to deal with natural and man-made emergencies. Due to funding delays, the FY25 grants will not be reviewed and approved until October 2025.

In FY24, staff assisted with the procurement of the yearly internet and phone subscriptions for the city of Rolla Fire and Rescue, procured four Level A Hazmat suits, a Hydrocarbon Leak Detector Kit, incident lights, a Multi-Rae System Monitor and Stop the Bleed Kits. The

group meets quarterly at MRPC.

# Greater Socio-Economic and Cultural Wealth through Community and Economic Development

#### Regional Planning Provides the Foundation for Future Growth

MRPC works within the eight-county region to plan for a better future. The planning department works in the areas of transportation planning, economic development planning, strategic planning and community health planning. One of the newer planning endeavors this year was the formation of a separate Multimodal Transportation Advisory Committee (MMTAC) to focus specifically on building out unfunded needs lists for each of the modes including transit, bike/pedestrian, ports, rail and airports.

Other current and completed projects include coordinating the Road and Bridge Transportation Advisory Committee (RBTAC); prioritizing transportation needs; updating the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP); working with the cities of Salem, Cuba, Steelville and Mineral Point on Active Transportation Plans; and wrapping up the MRPC Rural Opioid Initiatives project.

All projects start with planning. Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) Area Engineer Preston Kramer, MRPC Executive Director Bonnie Prigge and MRPC Planning Manager Anne Freand met with all eight counties in the fall of 2024 to discuss transportation needs on the state system for this planning effort of the region's nearly 13,000 mostly rural, state roadways.

The RBTAC reviewed the updated regional needs and prioritized them in December 2024, which were approved by MRPC and then shared with MoDOT for consideration in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). A new STIP for 2026-30 was

adopted in July 2025, which brings new road and bridge projects to the region. Both TACs (Road and Bridge and Multimodal) also worked on prioritizing the Tier I, 2 and 3 High-Priority, Unfunded Needs on the state system for road and bridge as well as multimodal projects in February 2025. Additionally, the committee prioritized Off-System Bridges (BRO) and the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) applications. Five projects for Belle, Waynesville, Owensville, Washington County and Rolla were funded through TAP in FY2026. The committee also completed a road safety audit for the intersection of Highways DD and U in Osage County.

MRPC partnered with the State and Central District Coalition for Roadway Safety to promote safe driving and reduce distracted driving. Efforts included Buckle Buddy a booster seat education program, bike/pedestrian safety, which included a week-long traffic garden at Belle Elementary in partnership with MoDOT. MRPC also expanded roadway safety outreach through social media to reach audiences beyond schools.



#### Meramec Regional Community Foundation

The Meramec Regional Community Foundation (MRCF) continued to grow in its charitable giving funds this year.

MRCF is an outgrowth of MRPC and is an affiliate of the Community Foundation of the Ozarks (CFO). The foundation is committed to developing a legacy of giving for the Meramec Region.

Its mission is to enhance the quality of life for current and future generations in the Meramec Region by establishing community foundations and perpetual, sustainable funds.

As of June 2025, MRCF has 53 funds valued at over \$4.6 million. Of the 53 funds, 16 funds provided 25 scholarships to graduating seniors in the Meramec Region with total giving of \$46,500.

This year, MRCF awarded two community grants in the amounts of \$750 each, totaling \$1,500, with the goal on enhancing and building stronger communities in the region. Through its annual grant-making, MRCF awarded the Armed Services YMCA of Missouri and KidSight for community projects focusing on children in the Meramec Region. Each program received \$750. MRCF's grant cycle opens in October each year and awards grants in March.

After a tornado struck Phelps County and Rolla, MRCF and the Phelps County Community Foundation (PCCF) began collecting donations through the Phelps County Disaster Relief Fund to support local recovery. More than \$104,000 was raised, with \$71,388 awarded through grants to eight nonprofits addressing tornado-related needs. Those receiving funds included the Phelps County Fair, The Salvation Army Phelps County Service Extension, the Phelps County Dream Center, the Phelps County Health Foundation, Russell House, The Commu-

nity Partnership, Choices for People and the Rolla Chamber Foundation. Additional funds will be distributed as additional needs are identified.

Jared Niederer of Owensville finished his term as MRCF's president in September 2025. Richard Cavender will serve as president for the upcoming year.

#### **Business Loans**

Meramec Regional Development Corp. was formed in the early 1990s to offer long-term, fixed financing in partnership with the U.S. Small Business Administration and local banks. As of June 3, 2025, MRDC voluntarily withdrew as an SBA certified development company. MRPC provided staff support to MRDC in the marketing, packaging, closing and servicing of SBA 504 loans across the region and the state. As the paperwork become more intense and there was less interest in the loan product, MRDC made the tough decision to withdraw from SBA. MRDC will maintain its 501(C)3 status and continue to serve as the loan review committee for MRPC revolving loan funds.

MRPC also paid off its USDA Intermediary Re-lending Program, which was a federal loan from USDA to resend to businesses in partnership with banks. With only one loan in the portfolio and other revolving loan funds available, MRPC decided to pay the loan off by June 30, 2025.

MRPC continues to own four Revolving Loan funds, provided through grants from U.S. Economic Develop-

ment Administration and the Missouri Department of Economic Development. The RLF loan programs were designed to provide gap financing in partnership with the local banks and offer long-term, fixed rates. The RLF loan programs are typically 40 percent of the total project, with the partner bank at 50 percent and borrower at 10 percent equity injection. MRPC takes a subordinate position to the bank on all project collateral.

Prior to CDC decertification, MRDC made a new loan totaling \$390,000 through the SBA 504 Program to a business located in Dent County that created/retained six jobs. The combined portfolio at the end of the fiscal year totaled more than \$1 million in remaining principle and created and/or retained approximately 93 jobs. Staff continues to package RLF loans for banks and provide loan and business development education for businesses and bankers. In FY24-25, staff serviced 19 SBA Loans, 16 RLFs and one IRP.

#### Project Development, Grant Writing and Project Implementation



Staff continued administering a CDBG and MDNR grant project for the city of Newburg to upgrade the city's water system. This project includes replacement of approximately 9,630 feet of water main with new fire hydrants, valves, service connections and pavement repair. Construction began in May of 2025. Work is being completed by Donald Maggi, Inc.

At MRPC, project development means turning community needs and ideas into real solutions. Staff work closely with local governments and nonprofits to plan and develop projects, write grants to secure funding and manage those grants from start to finish.

MRPC staff brings years of experience and a strong track record in grant writing. These grants often fund important community improvements like water and sewer systems, bridges, fire stations, senior centers, sidewalks, drainage upgrades, and housing demolition.

Grant applications can be complex and time-consuming—but MRPC is here to help. Grant writing is one of the many services offered to member communities.



#### MRPC secures over \$4 million in grants in FY 24-25

In 2024-25, MRPC's grant writers secured 13 successful grants, totaling \$4,071,196.60. Approved grants included:

- Washington County to replace two low water crossings on Hamilton Hollow Road \$206,000 (Delta Regional Authority (DRA) States Economic Development Assistance Program (SEDAP))
- City of Owensville to replace eight streetlights with energy efficient lights and ancillary infrastructure on Main Street \$500,000 (Missouri Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant)
- City of Bland for upgrades to the main streets in town with drainage and pavement improvements \$591,170
  (Missouri Department of Economic Development (MoDED) Community Development Block Grant
  (CDBG) General Infrastructure)
- City of Potosi for renovations to the Sayers Senior Center \$590,550 (MoDED CDBG Community Facilities)
- Gasconade County to upgrade Old Hwy 19, City Cemetery Road and Tappmeyer Road to improve safety and resiliency \$529,210 (MoDED CDBG General Infrastructure)
- Maries County to allow for the continuance of the county's Hazardous Materials Emergency Response Plan and first responder training for hazardous materials emergencies \$2,500 (Vichy Renewable Energy Community Giving)
- City of Chamois to create updated GIS water system maps \$15,000 (MDNR Water Safety & Security Act Project Grant)
- Washington County to host two historical performances during the Moses Austin Heritage Festival \$20,650 (Missouri Humanities Semi-Quincentennial program)
- MRPC to continue funding statewide docudrama planning assistance \$27,500 (Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) Highway Safety Program)
- MRPC to continue region-wide bicycle/pedestrian training programs \$46,599.60 (MoDOT's Highway Safety Program)
- City of Rolla to upgrade the storm drainage infrastructure serving the Rolla downtown business and arts district \$1,266,500 (DRA Community Infrastructure Fund)
- City of Dixon to replace 10 picnic tables and purchase 10 new tables made of recycled tires \$11,517 (MDNR's Non-Playground Scrap Tire Surface Material Grant)
- Washington County for sidewalk improvements around county facilities \$264,000 (MoDOT Transportation Alternatives Program)

In the past year, the community development team successfully secured funding for 13 grant applications, bringing over \$4 million to our region and state. Another nine grants submitted in the previous year added \$3.1 million more. We also submitted 19 additional proposals in FY 2024-25, covering projects like law enforcement hiring, economic development, bridge replacements and sidewalk improvements.

Grant administration is a core part of what MRPC does. Staff ensure that communities meet all grant requirements so they can continue receiving funding. In FY 2024-25, staff closed five grants and managed I4 ongoing projects, including:

MRPC finalized implementation of the Meramec Region Rural Opioid Initiatives in FY24-25. The grant worked to combat the growing problem of opioid use disorder through education, awareness and prevention strategies within MRPC's eight-county region. The initiatives were coordinated by two consortiums, funded by the Department of Justice's Opioid Affected Youth Initiative (OAYI) and the Health Resources and Service Administration. The OAYI project ended in September 2023.



Nearly 70 representatives, including first responders, local governments, emergency management officials, school personnel and Fort Leonard Wood, completed a severe weather tabletop exercise on June 18, 2025, as part of a Military Installation Readiness Review.

The scope of the work across the opioid initiatives included consortium meetings, a presence in the jails, the 25th judicial system and schools, assistance to employers through an employer-focused workshop, awareness activities, justice-involved job fairs and remembrance events, providing Narcan for health departments, providing drug take-back boxes and Narcan vending machines across the region. Staff provided an overview of work accomplished to the MRPC board in June 2025. The funding for the HRSA grant ended in September 2024.

Staff continued work on a Military Installation Readiness Review (MIRR) with Fort Leonard Wood and the surrounding counties and cities that includes a housing study and tabletop exercise. This study is funded by the Department of Defense Office of Local Defense Community Cooperation.

The MIRR is a tool for installations, communities and partnering entities to plan for and implement actions to make military installations and the communities around them better prepared for future disasters by reducing vulnerabilities and mitigating hazards. Benchmark Planning, a North Carolina consulting firm, was hired to conduct the resiliency study and PGAV, a St. Louis-based consulting firm, was hired to complete the housing study for the region. MRPC staff, lead by Assistant Director Tammy Snodgrass, planned and conducted the tabletop exercise with emergency response agencies.

MRPC continued work with the city of Hermann on a 10-year comprehensive plan, which will be completed in the fall of 2025. MRPC has also started work with the city of Potosi on a comprehensive plan that will be completed by the spring of 2027.

MRPC has continued its work developing Active Living Community of Practice and Active Transportation Plans for communities in the Meramec Region. These plans, funded by Missouri Department of Senior Services and University of Missouri Extension, prioritize sidewalk, bicycle and other multi-modal infrastructure that connect community areas of interest for overall user health and safety. Active transportation can boost local economies, increase physical health, improve the natural environment and provide affordable transportation access for all.

To date, MRPC has developed Active Living Community of Practice and Active Transportation Plans focusing on pedestrian infrastructure for the Meramec Region communities of Rosebud, Bland, Belle, Salem, Caledonia, Potosi, Mineral Point, Bourbon, Steelville and Cuba. A second enhanced plan has also been completed for the city of Salem, focused on a dedicated bicycle network and support amenities. MRPC has tentative plans with grant funders to complete work for the communities of Irondale, Leasburg and a second enhanced plan for Potosi in 2026.

MRPC also provides floodplain management services for Crawford County, Maries County, Phelps County and the cities of Meta and Salem. Staff provides floodplain information through brochures and press releases; technical assistance to the local governments on floodplain requirements and review of floodplain development permits. MRPC prepared the Floodplain Administrative Procedures Guides for Crawford, Maries, Phelps counties and Meta.

## A Unified Voice in the Legislative Process

Cities and counties in the Meramec Region have many commonalities, and what effects one, will most likely impact the majority. That is especially true of legislation. MRPC helps communities keep track of and be aware of proposed legislation so they can determine the impact on their jurisdictions.

It is critical that a town of 200 people has the same voice as a city of 200,000. MRPC's External Relations committee monitors legislation throughout the year and keeps the membership apprised through various legislative updates from a variety of sources. MRPC also serves as an advocate for its local governments, 36 cities and more than 196,000 residents. MRPC has an excellent rapport with its three state senators, eight state representatives, two U.S. senators and three U.S. representatives that serve various parts of the region. In any given legislative session, MRPC provides ideas and makes input to ensure the rural perspective is considered.

Each year, the MRPC board develops state and federal priority reports. State legislators were invited to discuss issues with the MRPC board and staff members at the January 2025 meeting, and the Meramec congressional delegation was invited to the February 2025 MRPC meeting to discuss federal issues. In January 2025, the MRPC board members and staff traveled to Jefferson City to visit with legislators and present them with MRPC's state priorities report.

Due to budget concerns, MRPC staff made the decision not to attend the National Association of Developmental Organizations (NADO) Washington Policy conference in D.C., where they would have visited in-person with the region's congressional leadership and presented them with the Federal Priorities Report with priorities set forth by the board. Instead the report was mailed to each of our federal congressional leaders to make them aware of the issues of importance the region.



For the last few years, MRPC has coordinated a group meeting to try and bring all senators and representatives together during its Day at the Capitol meetings to better utilize time to discuss the issues that matter to the Meramec Region. After meeting with Sen. Justin Brown and staff from Sen. Mike Henderson's office, the group posed for a picture outside Sen. Brown's office.



MRPC board members met with state representatives in Representative Bruce Sassman's office during the 2025 MRPC Day at the Capitol. The board and staff present all regional legislators with a copy of the State Priorities Report that outlines those issues the board has deemed high priority for the region.





# Eugene E. Northern Award Recipients

Eugene E. Northern was a judge in the 25th Circuit Court of Missouri. He practiced law in Rolla and served as Rolla city attorney for 20 years. Prior to becoming a judge, Northern served as mayor of Rolla in the 1960s and was a candidate for Congress in 1968. Judge Northern dedicated a lot of time to public service and went above and beyond the normal duties of the job.

As circuit judge, Northern established a juvenile division in the court system. His community contributions were directed toward young children, the law and law enforcement. He was dedicated to helping others. In 1983, by recognizing the late Judge Northern's efforts, the MRPC began a tradition of honoring an individual who possessed the commitment and dedication of Eugene E. Northern.
